CELEBRATING 10 YEARS OF SERVICE



Thanks to your continued support, 2021 marked 10 years of Little Essentials' service to NYC children and families in need! Our organization has grown from our Founder and President, Sandie Trombert's, living room to an established entity that, together with our partners and with the support of our sponsors, has served 49,838 children living in poverty.

We were able to reach this level of service in 2021 because of the Brooklyn Communities of Color, Robin Hood Foundation, Power of Two, Babs and Bill Lowenstein, the Steve Nash Foundation, Youth Friends Association, the Lowenstein Hanan Charitable Fund and the Monarch Foundation. Because of the support of our donor community, we surpassed our \$100k year end fundraising goal by \$28,286!

Little Essentials has experienced tremendous growth this year, from moving to a new home to hiring an outstanding new executive director to reaching major service milestones – all to the benefit of the families we serve.

We are happy to share some highlights from 2021:

 In March, we hired a new Executive Director, Courtney N. Crawford M.Ed. With over 18 years of experience working with families as an education advocate and school leader, she brings a wealth of knowledge about education, volunteerism, community organizing and social-emotional learning to the role. Ms. Crawford's foundation in education has fueled her passion to bring Little Essential's education workshops to families in all five boroughs.

One of Ms. Crawford's first initiatives was launching **The Three E's**, principles that will guide us for the next ten years. They include:

EMPOWERING the community by providing essential children's supplies to lessen the stress that comes with living in poverty.

EDUCATING families by providing tools and resources to strengthen parenting and individual skills.

ELIMINATING poverty by supporting families and financially compensating parents as Little Essentials' employees.

• We launched our educational workshops in 2013 offering infant and maternal health education through our partnership with <u>Tribeca Pediatrics</u>. This year, we added <u>six additional workshop subjects</u> to our programming, offered in Spanish and English, and hosted 10 workshops.

Our weekly in-person and virtual workshops are **led by volunteer educators** that include a Tribeca Pediatrics doctor, a Legal Aid attorney, a certified SPED coordinator and an instructional GED coach. By keeping our class sizes under 12, our educators ensure a safe and welcoming environment for learning.

To launch these new workshops, our team **connected with over 200 public and charter schools and organizations working with underserved families**. We also provided in-person outreach at community events with District 36 City Council Member Robert E. Cornegy and The Farragut Houses near the Brooklyn Navy Yard.

 In February, we moved to a 2500 sq. ft. warehouse in the Brooklyn Navy Yard, which could not have happened without the financial support of our partner, <u>Power of Two</u>. Our new home has been responsible for much of our service growth this year, as more space means that we can accept more donations, host more volunteers and ultimately serve even more NYC children in need.

• Thanks to **767 volunteers who provided 2879 hours of service** we saw a 25% increase in volunteers from 2020. Volunteers are the heart of Little Essentials and were responsible for filling over 260 orders. We welcomed help from 21 volunteer groups, including The Brooklyn Nets, Repair the World, JetSetGo, Salesforce and Facebook, thanks to a larger warehouse space where we could ensure social distancing and other safety measures.

 In response to increased donations and need from families, we established our new triannual Bundle-a-thons. At these events, volunteers helped prepare bundles of clothing for infants and toddlers, resulting in a total of 1880 clothing bundles.

 To help us manage our increased service, we hired Director of Operations, Chloe Muller, as well as Operations Associate and former LE intern, Brianna Garcia. These staff additions and our larger warehouse have allowed us to increase program capacity and have a greater impact on the families we serve.

- This year we maintained 28 community partners and provided service to 17 emergency partners. Our emergency partner program started as a response to the increased need created by the pandemic and allowed us to provide 424 emergency orders: a 40% increase from 2020.
- 1 in 3 families in the US struggles to provide enough diapers to keep their child clean and healthy. To date Little Essentials has provided 865,632 diapers and in 2021, we distributed 230,684 diapers thanks to donations from <u>Baby2Baby</u>, the <u>National Diaper Bank Network</u> and <u>HealthyBaby</u>.


- We established our <u>support of Black-owned businesses</u> in our community, by featuring them on our website and highlighting their work through our social media channels. These businesses include <u>Sparrow Credit Consulting</u>, <u>Brooklyn Tea</u>, <u>Becoming Beauty</u>, <u>Free the Curls</u>, <u>Embracing Communities Through Art</u> (ECTA) and <u>Call Chef Services</u>.
- In December, we launched our first annual Winter Mother's Makeover event with Black-owned salon <u>Becoming Beauty</u>. Three deserving mothers from our partner agencies were treated to hairstyling, nail service and massages.

has helped more than 49,000 children across New York City

3,346 Strollers

936 Car Seats

5,670 New York City children helped in 2021
\$226,234 worth of essential items distributed to families in need.
230,684 diapers distributed to keep babies clean and healthy
140 families received car seats, strollers and safe

142 families received car seats, strollers and safe sleep solutions.

OUR IMPACT

Our donation program has a significant positive impact on the environment, reducing waste by reusing clothing and gear and providing items to families instead of sending them to landfills. Items we cannot use are recycled or sent to other agencies like donateNYC.

51,410 pounds of materials distributed in NYC in 2021
donation drives, with recurring drives at Parachute Brooklyn, TransRe and Tribeca Pediatrics.
35,510 items of clothing and gear were recycled in 2021
132.39 metric tons of CO2 emissions conserved through our distribution of second-hand materials







Volunteer Hours YTY
















POPULATION SERVED




