

2018 ANNUAL REPORT

Thanks to your support 2018 was a great year for Little Essentials. Our capacity to serve more families living in poverty grew thanks to grants, individual donors, product donations, community partners, and volunteers.

Since our founding, Little Essentials has helped more than 33,000 children across New York City. In 2018 we assisted 7,531 children.

I am happy to share some other highlights from 2018:

- * We became a member of the National Diaper Bank Network and were invited to participate in the Proclamation Ceremony at City Hall recognizing the issue of diaper need in New York City and the member agencies that are working to alleviate this problem.
- * We hired a Warehouse Coordinator enabling us to double the number of orders filled in 2018 over 2017.
- * 240 individuals volunteered to work in our warehouse, sorting through donated items and assembling individualized packages for families. Fourteen corporations volunteered including Twitter Salesforce, West Elm, and Voya Financial.
- * We increased the number of community proplets orders for donations for their clier 19, enabling us to serve more low-in-

- * We received new product donations from TOMS shoes, aden + anais, Honest Diapers, Les Gamins, Les Petits Chapelais, What to Expect When You're Expecting and Hatch Maternity.
- * Little Essentials was chosen as the charitable partner for Luminaries at Brookfield Place New York. We received a donation of \$25,000 for wishes made by the public during the holiday season.
- * We will soon hire a Volunteer Coordinator, thanks to grants from Baby2Baby and the Atkins Foundation.

 Adding more volunteers means serving more families.

With new staff, more community partners, increased financial support and product donations, and our partnership with Tribeca Pediatrics, we are poised to serve more low-income children in 2019.

We are grateful for your support in 2018 and hope you will continue to help New York City's most vulnerable children in 2019. The need for our services remains high -- one in three children in New York City lives in poverty.





POPULATION SERVED


Population Served: Children




Population Served: Mothers




INCOME RECEIVED 2018
